We cannot be pepped up and enthusiastic about doing something exciting and feel dragged down by worry at the very same time. One kind of emotion drives out the other.

The secret of being miserable is to have the leisure to worry about whether you are happy or not.

It is utterly impossible for any human mind, no matter how brilliant, to think of more than one thing at any given time.

I must lose myself in action, lest I wither in despair.

Nature rushes in to fill the vacant mind. With what? Usually with emotions.

The remedy for worry is to get completely occupied doing something constructive.

Let's ask ourselves: What are the chances, according to the law of averages, that this event I am worrying about will ever happen?

Without purpose, the days would have ended, as such days always end, in disintegration, from trembling palsy of the soul which results from overmastering doubts, hesitations, vacillation and fear.

We lose many irreplaceable hours brooding over grievances that, in a year's time, will be forgotten by us and by everybody.

Let us devote our life to worthwhile actions and feelings, to great thoughts, real affections and enduring undertakings.

Stay busy. "I'm too busy. I have no time for worry."

And so it is with many petty worries. We dislike them and get into a stew, all because we exaggerate their importance. Life is too short to be little.

Let's not allow ourselves to be upset by small things we should despise and forget.

We are going to meet a lot of unpleasant situations that are so. They cannot be otherwise. We have our choice. We can either accept them as inevitable and adjust ourselves to them, or we can ruin our lives with rebellion and maybe end up with a nervous breakdown.
